The market is firm but quiet. The Sales are 500 bbls here at \$4.25 and 500 bbls at Pithole at \$4.05. We quote at \$4.20 @ \$4.25.

Petroleum market there is more inquiry for Crude in bulk, lots held 14 1/2 with 2000 bbls sold at this price, shipping order 19 1/2. Refined very quiet, there is small shipping demand, quote S. W. 26 1/2; Sales 1000 bbls for July 27 and 3500 bbls from May to November 500 bbls each month on private terms. Philadelphia is quiet and steady with moderate trade, sales 1000 bbls refined S. W. April at 25 1/2; 1500 bbls ditto at 25 1/2 and 4000 bbls from May to Dec. commencing 26 1/2 and advancing a half cent each month.
