The market remains dull and inactive. \$4.10 is the selling price offered, but we hear of one or two round lots sold on the lower road at \$4.15. Two cars sold here at \$4.10.

Reports of all the Sales of Petroleum in New York Yesterday.
Petroleum market crude quiet 14 3/4, lots 19 1/2, for shipping order 10,000 bbls were sold deliverable on the creek at \$4.05; in refined there is more demand for lots, but quiet market; spot delivery prices are unchanged, we quote at 25 for S. W. Sales 2000 bbls June and July at 26 1/2 and 3000 bbls for June, July and August 27. Naptha is dull at 10. Philadelphia delivery there is scarcely any demand with prices less nominal, quote refined S. W. at 25 1/2.
