ORDER OF Petroleum' Centre District Exchanges, Petroleum Centre April 23^d 1871. The market has been firm and active with an upward tendency all day, considerable inquiry for \$4.12 oil. The sales were 1500 bbls in two lots at \$4.15. Later offers were made as high as \$4.17 1/2, but refused.

Crude's look better demand, holders firm at 17 1/2, there is an inclination to pay this price, credit in shipping order increases much more attention and prices. Paraffin 10 1/2 bid 19 1/2 asked. In refined more doing in the market, exports and speculators both yet weak, business large; spot oil held a little higher, for future months a decided advance been obtained, inquiry for May delivery balance lots up 2800 bbls for April at 25, July 13,500 bbls for May at 26, 25 1/2 at 24 1/2; a small sale at inside prices; 1000 bbls for June 23 1/2, and 1000 bbls for August at 27 1/2.
