PETROLEUM CENTRE May 2

The market opened strong with more than
usual inquiry. Buyers are offering \$1.45
and 500 barrels were sold at that figure, but
there is very little oil here, and those that
have the fluid are holding for better prices.

Petroleum crude continues with fair in-
quiry. High prices asked, bulk lots quoted
16 with 1500 bbls sold in lots, shipping
order parcels 20 1/2. Refined still has con-
siderable attention, prices high, very strong,
spot lots 27 1/2, sales 3000 bbls on p. t. in-
cluding a lot at 27 1/2; 3000 bbls May, June,
and July 28 with this price freely bid.

Philadelphia delivery fair advance, prices
checked business to some extent, P. L. S. to
W. spot delivery 26 1/2 @ 27; sales 2500 bbls
S. W. May at above prices; 3000 bbls June
27 1/2 and 4000 bbls crude shipping order.
