PETROLEUM CENTRE, May 3rd  
The market has been firm but quiet all  
day. There has been two sales of 500 bbls  
lots at \$4.45, but most of the oil here is  
sold at \$4.50.

Petroleum market crude took some little  
demand from refiners to meet actual wants,  
but very little offering, and 10 is obtained  
for spot lots 500 bbls sold this figure deli-  
very next week, this price is shaded a  
trifle; 5000 bbls sold delivery next five  
weeks at 15 1/2; crude shipping order quoted  
20 1/2 with less demand. Reduced market  
strong, not much offering for immediate  
delivery; sales 20,000 s. w. for spot deli-  
very 27 1/2.  
Philadelphia delivery not much business,  
clearing light, of spot oil prices firm at the  
advance figure, buyers are backward, 5000  
bbls refined s. w. sold for July 27 1/2.
