Refined very strong, upward tendency, offering light, demand fair principally to meet wants of shippers; sales 1800 bbls standard white May 27 3/4, closing with this price freely bid, 2000 bbls May and June 27 3/4; 3000 bbls May, June and July 27 3/4; case oil meets good sale for shipments, light figures, 8000 cases sold p. t.

Philadelphia delivery prices advanced, closing with very strong market, 27 3/4 freely bid, sales 6000 bbls standard white May 27 3/4 and 17 3/4 @ 27 3/4; 4000 bbls June 27 3/4 @ 27 3/4, closing sales May and June p. t.; 2500 bbls July 17 3/4 @ 28.
