PETROLEUM CENTRE May 7

The market has been quiet here all day  
at \$4.55 as the offering price. At Rouse-  
ville things were lively and considerable oil  
changed hands at the following rates: \$4.-  
55, \$4.57½, \$4.60, and \$4.62½; the three  
last figures given were paid for 1000 bbls  
in lots.

Reports of all the Sales of Petroleum  
in New York Yesterday.

Crude in bulk market is in sellers favor,  
sales to-day in small lots to fill a few orders  
from refiners; sales 1200 bbls 16; crude  
shipping order held confined at 20½@20¾,  
no business reported, sales reported 400 bbls  
on upper creek at \$4.50. Refined market  
less active, offering continues small and  
principally delivery this month, prices firm,  
sales 3700 bbls deliverable to suit vessels  
27¾; 1000 bbls June and July at 28 and  
2500 bbls months June, July and August  
28¾.

Philadelphia delivery market less active,  
decidedly in sellers favor, may oil is diffi-  
cult to obtain for less than 28, sales 1500  
bbls standard white May 57¾; 3900 bbls  
May p. t.; 4000 bbls ditto last half p. t.,  
supposed 27¾ and 1500 bbls May, June and  
July 28.
