Philadelphia delivery business extremely limited with lower prices ruling; sales 1000 bbls refined S. W. for May 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ and reported 6000 bbls from July to Dec. at 28 $\frac{1}{2}$; v. e. quote May 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ and June 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ at 27 $\frac{1}{2}$.
