Petroleum Market crude in bulk rather neglected, few small parcels to meet pressing wants. Refined lower, prices quoted 15 1/2 with 1000 bbls sold this figure, crude shipping order offered freely, quoted 20 @ 20 1/2; sales 3000 bbls part at latter figure; in refined large business was consummated to day considerable disposition to realize, market crowded with oil, all delivery prices opened and changed a fraction and declined subsequently, ran down to 26 1/2 @ 26 3/4; May delivery prices show corresponding decline, demand in part shipping largely from speculators; sales 5000 bbls S. W. May 27 1/2; 3000 bbls ditto 27 1/2; 2500 bbls June commencing 27 1/2 closing 26 1/2; 3000 bbls July 26 1/2 @ 27; 3000 bbls June and July 26 1/2; 5000 bbls June, July and Aug. 27 1/2.

Philadelphia delivery downward tendency, speculators and exports buying largely, considerable oil pushed in market, prices closed weak; sales 8000 bbls refined S. W. May delivery 27 1/2.
