As I write with difficulty I can only state the conclusions to which my mind has come after a carein-examination of this case.

The complainant has exhibited a 'patent dated 25th of April, 1856. This is prima facie evidence of a good title, and puts on the respondents the burden of preof that the patent is void or worthless.
