SECOND DAY.

No. 3--Purse \$1,150. Free for all horses. \$600 to the first, \$350 to the second, \$150 to the third and \$100 to the fourth.

No. 4--Purse \$400 for horses that have never beaten 2:44. \$250 to the first, \$100 to the second and \$50 to the third.
