FIRST DAY.
No. 1 - Purse \$400 for horses owned in Venango and Crawford counties sixty days previous to the closing of the entries, that have never trotted better than 2:48. \$200 to the first, \$125 to the second and \$75 to the third horse.
No. 2 - Purse \$500 for horses, \$175 to the first, \$85 to the second, and \$45 to the third.
SECOND DAY.
No. 3 - Purse \$1,175 for all horses, \$700 to the first, \$300 to the second, \$175 to the third and \$100 to the fourth.
No. 4 - Purse \$300 for horses that have never trotted better than 2:48. \$150 to the first, \$80 to the second and \$70 to the third.

All the above money will be paid to the first three in five to five minutes, and will be paid under the rules of the National Association for the promotion of the interests of the American trotting turf. A horse claiming the gold shall only be entitled to the first premium.
