JUNE MEETING OF THE OIL CITY PARK ASSOCIATION

(Member National Association) Will be held Tuesday & Wednesday June 14th and 15th.

**PREMIUMS \$2,275!**

FIRST DAY.

No. 1--Purse \$400 for horses owned in Venango and Crawford counties sixty days previous to the closing of the entries, that have never trotted better than 2:30, \$200 to the first, \$125 to the second and \$75 to the third horse.

No. 2--Purse \$250 for one or more, \$175 to the first, \$50 to the second, and \$25 to the third.

SECOND DAY.

No. 3--Purse \$1,175 Free for all horses \$500 to the first, \$300 to the second, \$175 to the third and \$100 to the fourth.

No. 4--Purse \$200 for horses that have never beaten 2:41. \$250 to the first, \$100 to the second and \$50 to the third.

All the above races are mile heats, best three in five, to harness, and will be conducted under the rules of the National Association for the promotion of the interests of the American trotting turf. A horse claiming the first prize only permitted to the first prize.

The entries will close at Oil City on Saturday June 13, at 9 P. M. addressed to A. D. Harbour, Oil City, Pennsylvania.
