FIRST DAY.

No. 1.--Purse \$400 for horses owned in Venan-
go and Crawford counties sixty days previous to
the closing of the entries, that have never trotted
better than 2:48. \$200 to the first, \$125 to the
second and \$75 to the third horse.
No. 2.--Purse \$300 for horses \$175 to the first,
\$85 to the second, and \$40 to the third.

SECOND DAY.

No. 3.--Purse \$1,175. Free for all horses. \$50
to the first, \$80 to the second, \$155 to the third
and \$100 to the fourth.
No. 4.--Purse \$200 for horses that have never
better than 2:41. \$75 to the first, \$50 to the second
and \$50 to the third.

All the above races are mile heats, best three in
five, in harness, and will be conducted under the
rules of the National Association for the promotion
of the interests of the American trotting turf. A
horse distancing the field shall only be entitled to
the first premium.
The entries will close at Oil City on Saturday
June 11, at 9 P. M.
