The case was argued three days by Charles M. Keller of New York, B. F. Lucas and S. A. Purvianes of Pittsburgh, for defendants, and George Harding of Philadelphia, and George H. Christy, o Pittsburgh, for plaintiff.

As I write with difficulty I can only state the conclusions to which my mind has come after a carein examination of this case.

The complainant has exhibited a pattern dated 23th of April, 1835. This is prima facts evidence of a goot ittle, and put on the respondents the burden of proof that the patent is void or worthless. I need not repeat my remarks in the case of Goodyser vs. Day (2 Wall, C. C. Rep. 225.) but now adopt them as affording a rule of detailon which apples clearly to the present case.

As the infringement of the patent is a limited, the only question will be as to the validity of complainants patent of April 25,1838.

Note.—The passage referred to by Judge Grier in his former decision. 3 Wallace, p. 299, adopted as applicable to this case was as follows:

"It is usually the case, when any valuable discovery is unde, or any new machine of great mility is invented, that the attention of the public has been turaed to that subject previously, and that many persons have been making researches and experiments. Philosophics and mechanicians may have measure anticipated in their speculations the possibility or producility of such discovery or invention; many experiments have been successfully indeed, coming very near, yet failing short of the desired result. They have produced nothing beneficial. The invention when perfected may truly be said to be the culminating point of many experiments, not only by the loventor, but by many others, it is may have profited indirectly by the unsuccessful experiments and failures of others, but is gives them no right to claim a share of the henor of the profit of the successful inventor. It is when speculation has been reduced to practice, when experiment as resulted in discovery, and when that discovery has been perfected by patient and continued experiments, when some new exappoind, art manufacture, or machine has been thus produced which is useful to the public, that the party making it becomes apublic ben factor one emitted to a patent.
