The centre of interest in Wall street yesterday was the gold market, which was thrown into excitement without parallel since the September panic by the warlike advices from Europe. Before the formal opening of the room sales were between 14% and 15%; The first recorded sales were at 151%, between which citement continued until the close of the day. The gross clearings were over \$100,000,000.
