WAR INEVITABLE.

FRANCE DECLARES WAR.

Paris, July 15. A dispatch dated noon says: War has been declared by the Corps Legistaff.

BRUSSELS, July 15.

The intervention of the great Powers has been ineffectual. Napoleon will announce to-day its inplure of relations between France and Prussia and a dectaration of war official.

BERLIN, July 15-3 p. m. Hostilities have already begun.

Munten, July 15-3 p. m. The Bayarian Government announces it will remain neutral, but the King and his people would not separate themselves from

Pavis, July 15. Holland will remain neutral in the struggle. The beligerents have engaged to respect the neutrality of Belgium. yet troops are rapidly concentrating at Antwerp and other stragetic points.

Germany.

Panis, July 15. It is reported the Emperor has received a dispatch from Queen Victoria this morning making a last appeal for peace, and a similar dispatch was also seat to the King o Prussia.

It is said a proclamation has been signed by Napoleon and prepared for distribution throughout the German States as soon as the French troops cross the frontier. It asserts to the German people that France wars sgainst Prussia, not Germany, and with no idea of conquest. An enormous number of copies bave already been print-
