As I write with difficulty I can only state the conclusions to which my mind has come after a careful and the complainant has exhibited a patent dated 25th of April, 1555. This is prima facle evidence of a good title, and puts on the respondents the burden of proof that the patent is void or worthless.

I need not repeat my remarks in the case of Goodyatt vs. Day (2 Wall, C. C. Rett. 220.) but now adopt them as affording a rule of decision which applies clearly to the present case.

As the infiningement of the patent is admitted, the only question will be as to the validity of complainants patent of April 25, 1853.
