There were sales late last eve. of 1500 bbls at 3.45. Also the following "put" made: For 5000 bbls B. O., all year, at \$4.00, \$3.00; 2000 bbls B O all year, at \$4.00, \$2.00. We quote at \$3.40 to \$3.45.

Crude in bulk rather scarce for immediate delivery, and holders unwilling to work off supplies at late prices. Demand rather better and wholly from refiners. 600 bbls at 12 1/2 and 1000 bbls private terms, closing with 12 1/2 asked. Crude shipping order offered at easier figures with light demand. We quote at 16 1/2 @ 17. Refined sales very little this prices rather more in buyers favor, principal demand been from shippers. earlier 4000 bbls for short delivery 24 1/2 and 3500 lbs Aug. 24 1/2. Jobbing rates marking at 28 @ 28 1/2. Case oil unchanged very small inquiry, 28 1/2 @ 29 still quoted without important sales.
