Crude shipping order remains neglected and difficult to give fair price, quoted at 16\$16.

Refined, demand nearly all at short delivery fractions advanced obtained, closing very strong at 21\$16. Aug sales 5000 blbs S.W. on spot at 21\$15; 5000 blbs last half month at 21\$15; 1000 blbs do early in day at 21\$15.

5000 blbs, parcel to full vessels at 25.

Patia market has shown more activity with fair inquiry and disposition on part of exporters to meet enhanced prices, still some reluctance to engage large transactions.—
