The following is the decision rendered by Judge Gries on the twenty-second (22) day of September, 1800, in the United States Circuit Court at Philadelphia. The case was argued three days by Charles M. Keller of New York, B. F. Lucas and S. A. Purviance of Pittaburgh, for defendants, and George Harding of Philadelphia, and George H. Christy, of Pittaburgh, for plaintiff.

OPINION OF JUDGE GRIER.

At I write with difficulty I can only state the conclusions to which my mind has come after a careful-examination of this case.

The complainant has exhibited a patent dated 25th of April, 1836. This is prima facts evidence of a good title, and puts on the respondents the burden of proof that the patent is void or worthless.

I need not repeat my remarks in the case of Goodyser's Day (2 Wall, C. C. Rep. 225.) but now adopt them as affording a rule of decision which applies clearly to the present case.

As the infringement of the patent is admitted, the only question will be as to the validity of complainants patent of April 33, 1838.

"It was after speculation had been reduced to practice," and after repeated experiments, that the complainant succeeded in overcoming the prejudice and ignorance of the people on the subject, and persuading the public that his invention was useful; after he had established its great utility and value, and "when his genius and patient persevenance, in apits of sneers and scoffs," were completely successful, that Reed, who had before made experiments on the same subject, and was unsuccessful, imagined that he had the best right to the invention, and after purchasing one or more complainant's tor pedoes, he applied on the 1st of November, 1867, for a patent for substantially the same month the respondents formed themselves into a company or corporation called "The Reed Torpedo Company," for the purpose of pirating the complainant's invention, and supporting the expense of litigation, and thus defraud him of the fruits. They have per severed, even after the preliminary injunction very properly granted by the District Jindge.

Let a decree be entered for complainant for a perpetual injunction, and a Massler appointed to take an account according to the prayer of the bill.

NOTE.—The passage referred to by Judge Grier in his former decis'on, 3 Wallace, p. 299, adopted as applicable to this case was as follows:

"It is usually the case, when any valuable discovery is made, or any new machine of great utility is invented, that the attention of the public has been turned to that subject previously, and that many persons have been making researches and experiments. Philosophers and mechanicians may have means measure anticipated in their speculations the possibility or probability of such discovery or invention; many experiments have been successfully tried, coming very pear, yet failing short of the desired result. They have produced nothing beneficial. The invention when perfected may truly be said to be the culminating point of many experiments, not only by the inventor, but by many others, in the invention when perfected may truly be said to be the culminating point of many experiments, and failures of others, but it gives them no right to claim a share of the hc nor of the profit of the successful inventor. It is when speculation has been reduced to practice, when experiment has resulted in distovery, and when that discovery has been perfected by patient and continued experiments, when some new compound, art, manufacture, or machine has been thus produced which is useful to the public, that the party making it becomes a public benefactor and entitled to a patent.—"And yet when genius and patient perseverance have at length succeeded, in spite of succers, how seldom is it followed by reward! Envy robs him of the honor, white speculators, swindless, and pirates rob him of the profits. Every unsaccessful experiments are ight to pirate the original discovery how and not summons Morse, or Blanchard, or Woodworth to prove that this is the usual history of every great discovery or invention.
