London, Oct. 31.

It is generally believed in the stock Exchange that Paris will offer a determined resistance to the besiegers.

Vienna, Oct. 31.

As Prussia still demands the cessation of territory from France as a preliminary of peace, it is believed in official circles here that war must proceed indefinitely.

Tours, Oct. 31.

Protects and military commanders of a large number of Departments have telegraphed to the Minister here expressing the utmost indignation at the surrender of Metz.

The agitation here is extreme, and rumors circulating all day contribute to increase the public anxiety.

Somewhat that peace has been signed without reference to the Tours government, that Bazaine has been acting in accordance with instructions from Napoleon, and that Comantier, refusing to surrender, took command of the troops in Metz, and will cut his way out.
