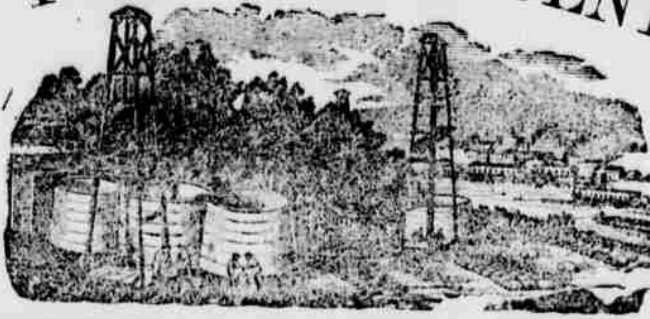

 not be used in the boilers.

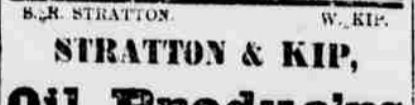
