The sales were 500 bbls gravity at \$3.45; 2,500 bbls do in two lots at \$3.50; 250 bbls do (local) at \$3.55 and 1000 bbls regular at \$3.40; 500 bbls do. at \$3.45. At the close \$3.45 and \$3.50 were freely offered but refused.
