MONTHLY OIL REPORT. Below we present our usual monthly oil report for the month of January. The production of the McCray farm for the month of October was 2,685 barrels per day; for the month of November, 1,944 barrels per day; for the month of December, 1,206 barrels per day, and for the month of January, 978 barrels per day, being a decrease of 1,708 barrels from the October report.
