OPINION OF JUDGE GRIER.
 As I write with pleasure I can only cite the conclusions to which my mind has come after a careful examination of this case.

The claimant has exhibited a patent dated 20th of April, 1868. This is prima facie evidence of a good title and puts on the respondents the burden of proof to show that the patent is void or voidable.

It was also shown that the claimant had succeeded in procuring the patent, and that he had established its good title and value, and that he had acted with good faith and integrity.

As the respondents have failed to show that the claimant's patent is void or voidable, the court has affirmed the patent.

NOTE.—The passage referred to by Judge Grier in his former decision, 3 Wallace, p. 259, adopted as applicable to this case, was as follows:

It is true that the case, when any valuable discovery is made, or any new measure of great utility is invented, that the attention of the public has been directed to that subject previously, and that many persons have been making researches and experiments.

It is also true that the inventor, in his search for a remedy, has been hindered by the knowledge of the progress of other inventors.

But the law is not to be made by the courts. It is to be made by the legislature. It is to be made by the people.

And yet when genius and patient perseverance have at length succeeded, in a life of toils and sorrows, some valuable invention or discovery, how seldom is it followed by reward!
