MONTHLY OIL REPORT. We present to-day our usual oil report for the month of April. There has been less failing off during this month than for several months past. During Match the greatest falling off was on the McCray farm being 252 barrels per day. During the month of April this farm exhibits an increase of 27 barrrels per day. In March the productioon was 313 barrels per day, and in April 340 barrela. A pumber of the other farms show? a falling of but the greater part hold their own since the March report was published. The following table shows the decrease per day on the principal farms and tracts: Pearson farm, 6 barrel Columbia farm, 47 ... Ningara farm, 15 .. Lake farm, 1.64 10 5 44 Central farm. The Daizell, A. Boyd, Sam. Boyd, ME b ny Metropolitan, Brown, Cornen and other farms and tracts exhibit an increase in production over the month of March .--The total average of the several farms and tracts as given in our table shows a daily prduction of 1,780 barrels, a decrease of

63 barrels since the March report. As we predicted in our March report developing, was quite lively during the month of April and promises to be more se during the present month. On the Brown farm, Lake farm and Metropolitan tract, Cherrytree Run, a large number of leases have been taken and wells are to be put down at once, drilling having commerced on several already. On the Cornea farm four new wells are to be started at once. Leases are also being taken on the Buchanan farm. lying back of the Columbia farm, and the indications are favorable for good paying wells being struck on that farm. There are at present from 30 to 40 new wells going down or about to be started in this vicinity. On the whole the business of developing presents a favorable aspect at present. much more so than it has for several months past. It will be seen that the Stevenson farm has been abandoned, having been flooded

out by water. Included in our report for April will be found three or four tracts never before reported by us, located on Cherrytree Run. The production of these farms has been

taken into consideration in showing the decrease since last month. On the first day of the month there was

in iron tanks at this point 152,335. barrels, an increase of 5,956 barrels since March first. During the month the shipments from this point of crude and refined oil was 27,324 barrels, against 23,565 during March, an increase of 3,7 59.

Included in our report will by found a table of the production of each lease on the McCray farm, also the amount of oll held in Iron tankage by Mr. McCray.


