Great Fire at Fagundas!

FORTY-SEVEN BUILDINGS BURNED! NEARLY THE ENTIRE PLACE DESTROYED!

We learn that yesterday afternoon, during the prevalence of a high wind, a fire broke out in an old shanty, in rear of the McKinney Hotel, at Fagundas City, quickly consuming it.

From this point the fire spread to the McKinney Hotel, and although the utmost endeavors were used by the citizens to stay its progress their efforts were futile, the flames aided by a stiff breeze spreading to the adjoining buildings and the whole street was quickly destroyed.

Among those burned out were Andrews hardware store, Smith's grocery store, Seymour's hardware store, and a large number of business places, residences, &c.

During the past month the James well No. 2, has sold 2,255 barrels of oil.

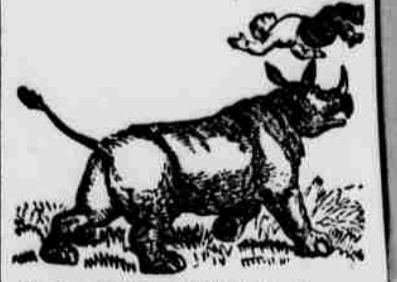

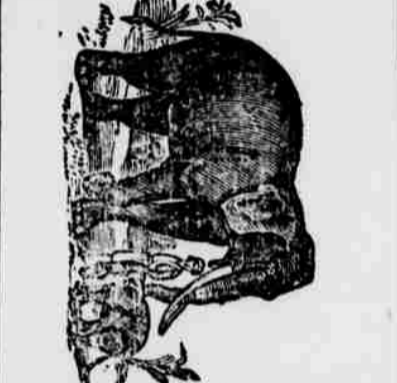
