Au secident occurred on the Hanns farm ast evening, by which a man in the employ of Mr. I. S. Gibson, Superintendent of the farm was near losing his life. It appears that parties were employed in withdrawing the tubing, and Mr. vantine, one of the number, was up in the derrick about forty feet above the floor. As the work was progressing, the tubing parted, and permitted the gas to escape, which filled the surrounding atmosphere and penetrated the enginehouse, took fire from the furnace, and with a report like the disobarge of a heavy piece of ordnance flashed back to the derrick and completely enveloped everything in flamer. The men at work on the floor of Mr. Vantine the case was different. He with a presence of mind which has in times past made men famous in history, seized hold of the rope by which the tubing was being withdrawn and let himself down through the seething flames and escaped mith the loss of bair, beard, and the greater portion of his clothing. The injuries he received from the flames were very severe and painful, and it will be many days before he can resume his avocation. BURNING WELL .- In well No. 11, on the Angell & Prentice Tract, near Foster, on the Allegbeny river, a vein of gas and oil was struck this morning at 7 o'clock, three feet in the third sand. The well took fire soon after being struck, and was still burning at latest dates. A pipe was arranged to carry the oil away, and through this it is pumping at the rate of fully 150 barrels per day. -Oil City Register.

We learn from parties who arrived from Foster, last evening, that the well is flowing from 300 to 400 barrels per day .-The production is probably over estimated somewhat,

The Perrysville correspondent of the Ctarion Democrat gives the following interesting oil news:

Our oil interests are still flourishing as usual, and a general stir is visible among oil men regarding Clarion county territory The Lady Thorne; a new strike on the Crawford tract, is or has been doing from 16 to 15 barrels. They are about torpedoing it, when we look for better results .-The Extenuate, on the Pollock farm, and the Fairchance No. 2. are rapidly nearing completion. The one owned by Wiser and others, and the other by Gosser, the Old Man and the Boy, on Crawford tract, are drilled between 600 and 800 feet. The Cronstadt, is the name of a new well just started on the Crawford tract. Hyde & the derrick escaped without harm, but with Gailey have the rig up for a new well just above the Phillips House, on the company's land. Kipp & Churchill have the timber on the ground for another well on the Anchors farm. Piper & Brown are getting ready for hostilities on the Kelly farm, and R. L. Brown and others on the Graham tract; Billy Connor & Co., on land of H. C. Reichart. Leases have also been given out by Jerry Doelan on his farm to different parties. On the Stewart farm parties are contemplating operations. Kern & Noss have secured a part of the Mcliwaine & Latshaw farms, and are going to put a 'wild cat" well on the same. The eld Hagantown well, which was pronounced a failure by the company which put it down has never ceased to produce a small amount of oil, but not being deep enough it was no fair test of the territory.
