The following is the decision rendered by Judge Order on the twenty-second (22) day of 24, January, 1899, in the United States Circuit Court at Philadelphia.

OPINION OF JUDGE GRIFF. As I write with alacrity I can only state the conclusions to which my mind has come after a careful examination of this case.

The defendant has exhibited a patent dated 25th of April, 1896. This is prima facie evidence of a good title, and puts on the respondent the burden of proof that the patent is void or worthless.

I need not repeat my remarks in the case of Good year vs. Day (2 Wall. C. C. Rep. 259) but now adopt them in advising a rule of decision which applies directly to the present case.

As the infringement of the patent is admitted, the only question will be as to the validity of the complainant's patent of April 25, 1896.

It was after speculation had been reduced to practice, and after repeated experiments that the complainant succeeded in overhauling the defendant's and in ascertaining the nature of the subject matter...

Let a decree be entered for judgment for a perpetual injunction, and a Master appointed to take an account according to the paper of the bill.

NOTE—The passage referred to by Judge Grier in his former decision, Wallace, p. 259, adopted as applicable to this case was as follows:

It is usually the case when any valuable discovery is made, or any new machine or process is invented, that the attention of the public has been directed to that subject previously, and that many persons have been making experiments and carrying on investigations...
