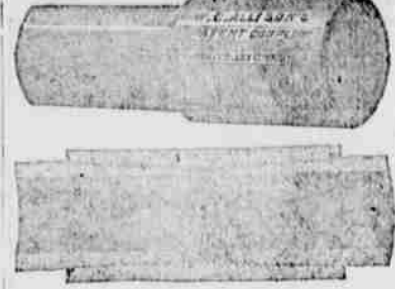

OPINION OF JUDGE GRIER

As I write with difficulty I can only state the con-

clusions to which my mind has come after a careful

The complainant has exhibited a patent dated

good title, and puts on the respondents the bur-

den of proof that the patent is void or worthless.

I need not repeat my remarks in the case of Good-

year vs. Day (2 Wall. C. C. Rep. 235) but will

adopt them as affording a fair and decided which ap-

plies equally to the present case.

As the infringement of the patent is admitted,

the one question will be as to the validity of the

complainant's patent of April 25, 1868.
