COAL OIL ON THE WATER .- The Secre COAL OIL ON THE WATER.—The Secre-tary of the Treasury informs the Special Treasury Agent at New Orleans that, ac-cording to sections 4 and 5 jof the act of Congress of February 28, 1871, and the reg-ulation adopted by the Board of Supervis-ing Inspectors of steamboats at their last session, coal oil cannot be transported on passenger steam vessels; also, that crude and refused petroleum can be transported on passenger steamboats when there is no other practical means of transporting it, such as practical means of transporting it, such as by railroads and freight lines of steamboats. When carried on a passenger steamboat the oil must be placed by the guards or forward main deck, and must not be above 110 degrees temperature.
