

The following is the decision rendered by Judge  
 Grier on the Twentieth (20) day of February,  
 1872, in the United States Circuit Court at Philadel-  
 phia. The case was argued three days by Charles  
 M. Keller of New York, R. F. Lucas and S. A. Parvane  
 of Pittsburgh, for defendants, and George  
 Harving of Philadelphia, and George H. Christy, of  
 Pittsburgh, for plaintiff.

**OPINION OF JUDGE GRIER**  
 As I write with difficulty I can only state the con-  
 clusions to which my mind has come after a careful  
 examination of this case.

The complainant has exhibited a patent dated  
 25th of April, 1868. This is prima facie evidence of  
 a good title, and puts on the respondents the bur-  
 den of proof that the patent is void or worthless.  
 I need not repeat my remarks in the case of Good-  
 year vs. Day (2 Wall. C. C. Rep. 229) but now  
 adopt them as affording a rule of decision which ap-  
 plics clearly to the present case.  
 As the infringement of the patent is admitted,  
 the only question will be as to the validity of com-  
 plainant's patent of April 25, 1868.  
 "I was," after speciality had been reduced to  
 practice, and after repeated experiments, that in  
 complainant succeeded in over coming the prejudice  
 and ignorance of the people on the subject, and  
 re-educating the public that his invention was useful  
 and he had established his great utility and value  
 and when his genius and patient perseverance, in-  
 spite of sneers, the scoffs, and the complete re-  
 sult, that he had, who had before made experi-  
 ments on the same subject, and was unsuccessful,  
 and after purchasing one or more complainant's tor-  
 pedoes, he applied on the 1st of November, 1867,  
 for a patent for substantially the same combi-  
 nation of devices and machine contained in com-  
 plainant's patent. On the 15th of the same month  
 respondent's friend the same was into a contract of  
 invention called "The Torpedo Company," for  
 the purpose of paying the expenses of litigation,  
 and thus defrauding him of the fruits. They have  
 secured, even after the preliminary injunction very  
 properly granted by the learned Judge:

Let a degree be entered for complainant for a per-  
 petual injunction, and a Master appointed to take  
 an account according to the order of the bill.  
**R. C. GRIER, Judge.**

**NOTE**—The passage referred to by Judge Grier in  
 his former decision, 3 Wallace, p. 229, adopted as  
 applicable to this case was as follows:  
 "It is usually the case, when any valuable discov-  
 ery is made, or any new machine of great utility is  
 invented, that imitators of the public have been  
 urged to that subject previously, and that many  
 persons have been making researches and experi-  
 ments. Philosophers and mechanics may have  
 in some measure anticipated in their speculations  
 the possibility or probability of such discovery or  
 invention; many experiments have been success-  
 fully tried, coming very near, yet falling short of  
 the desired result. They have produced nothing but  
 failure. The invention when perfected may truly be  
 said to be the culminating point of many experi-  
 ments, not only by the inventor, but by many others.  
 He may have profited indirectly by the success-  
 ful experiments and failures of others, but it  
 gives them no right to claim a share of the honor  
 of the profit of the successful inventor. It is when  
 speculation has been reduced to practice, when ex-  
 periment has resulted in discovery, and when that  
 discovery has been perfected by patient and contin-  
 uous experiments, when some new compound, and  
 manufacture, or machine has been thus produced  
 which is useful to the public, that the party making  
 it becomes a public benefactor and entitled to a patent.  
 "And yet genius and patient perseverance  
 have at length succeeded, in spite of sneers and  
 scoffs, some valuable invention or discovery, how-  
 seldom is it followed by reward. Every man  
 of the honor, while speculating, and while mak-  
 ing his first experiments, every unsuccessful  
 experimenter who did or did not do some very  
 near making a discovery now claims it. Every one  
 who can invent an improvement or vary his inven-  
 tion claims a right to share the original discovery. We  
 need not suppose that some, or the blunder, or we  
 worth to prove that this is the actual history of  
 every great discovery or invention.  
 "The present case is a satisfactory chapter to this  
 long and uniform history."—2 Wallace, C. C. Re-  
 ports, p. 229.
