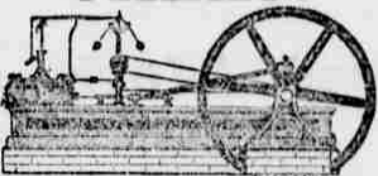
COMMISSIONER March 23d, 1872.
