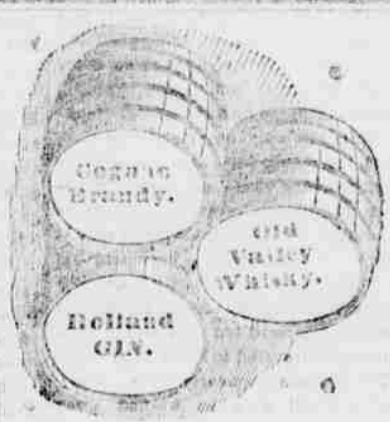
Another Valuable Invention.
