The supposed gull dropped dead in the water, but proved to be a woman, who, with her husband, was fishing, and who, to keep off the dew and insects, had thrown a white handkerchief over her head.

Last week the number of deaths in New York city was 1,956. This is 513 less than the terrible record of the previous week. It is still, however, 436 above the average of the first six months of the year, and represents a proportion equal to 56.6 per 1,000 per annum, which is at least twice as much as it ought to be. As in the first week of July, the greater part of the mortality of last week will doubtless be found to be made up of children under five years of age.—New York Times.

A new departure has been made in the whale-oil trade. The cargo of a vessel lately arrived at San Francisco, from New Zealand, has been transhipped via Panama to New York. This will accomplish a great saving in time, as formerly all cargoes were sent round Cape Horn.

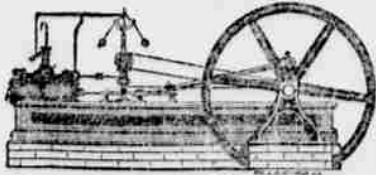

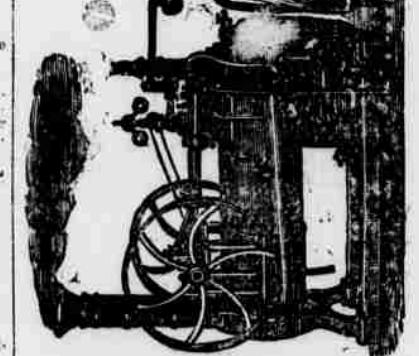
