The Tionesta Republican says: The bridge men are now at work on this side of the river, the two piers and abutment on the other side being built above high water mark, and it is likely that the next high water will not in any way interfere with the work. As far as the bridge has proceeded, it is the most permanent and substantial structure of the kind we have seen any where.

Developments in the Sugarcreek lubricating district, near this city, are being pushed rapidly, and good strikes are numerous. The Fee, McC amount and Galloway tracts are the most productive, while derricks are being erected far beyond the producing territory, in a northeastern direction, by parties who have secured leases. We are informed that Jonathan Watson of Titusville, and other extensive operators, are purchasing and leasing lands south of Cherrytree, and a few miles back of Reno, upon which developments will soon be commenced. — [Venango Citizen.]

One of the old British guns on the fleet captured by Commodore Perry during the war of 1812 has just been presented to the Cleveland Historical Society. It is to be placed at the base of the statue of Perry in the public park of that city.

An enterprising genius has started a wholesale steam chicken factory at Elgin, Ill. His experimental "set" of eggs, consisting of several thousand, was laid in place recently, but unfortunately the steam was turned on too fast and the entire nest cooked instead of hatched.

The construction of the New York underground railroad is to commence in September. The letting of contracts, and estimates, and preparations of the character of the work, will occupy until that time.

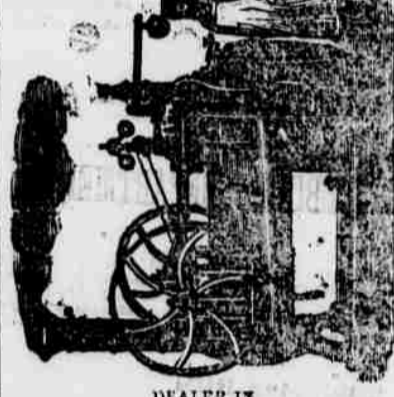
