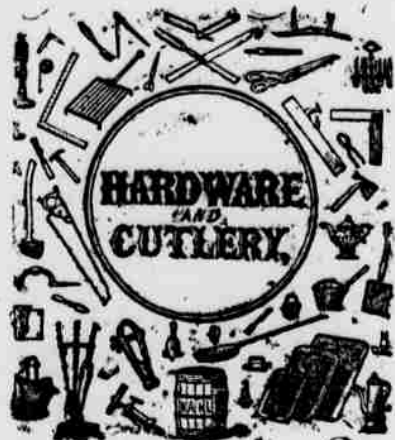

GRAND & FT CONCERT!

Postponed to December 7, 1872.

THE SECOND GRAND GIFT CONCERT in aid of the PUBLIC LIBRARY OF KENTUCKY, announced for September 28, has been postponed to DECEMBER 7, 1872, because the accumulation of orders the few days before the drawing made it physically impossible to fill them without a few days' delay, and as a short postponement was inevitable, it was determined to do it to a time that would make a full drawing sure by the sale of all the tickets.

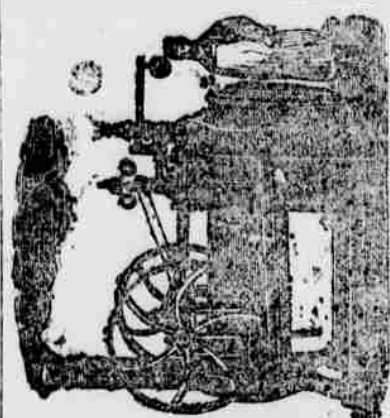
