**THE**  
**TORPEDO PATENT SUITS.**  
**Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer.**

The following is the decision rendered by Judge  
 McKean, at May Term of the Circuit Court in the  
 above case:

In the Circuit Court of the United States, in and for  
 the Western District of Pennsylvania.—E. A. L.  
 Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer.—No. 1.—May Term  
 1872.—In Equity.

November 27, 1872. Bill filed and subpoena is-  
 sued.

Subpoena and notice of application for prelimi-  
 nary injunction served.

December 12, 1872. Motion for preliminary in-  
 junction heard, and the Court being duly advised, in-  
 terlocutory injunction awarded as prayed for,  
 and docketed.

January 14, 1873. Inducement issued, and on the  
 29th day of January inducement served personally  
 and by copy.

May 22, 1873. Rule issued for defendant to show  
 cause why attachment should not issue for contempt  
 by violating injunction and duly served.

June 24, 1873. Rule for attachment in this case  
 came on to be heard, and after argument of counsel  
 pro and con, the Court being fully advised in the  
 premises, the rule is made absolute, and the mar-  
 tians of the Court, that the said defendant, Nicho-  
 las Geyer, be imprisoned in the common jail of  
 Allegheny County for and during the term of ten  
 days, and that he pay the costs of this proceed-  
 ing.

—June 25, 1873. Commitment issued.

The litigation in this case was for infringement  
 of the Roberts' patent of No.—entitled the Tor-  
 pedo, for an apparatus for the production of all water  
 The act of infringement for which the defendant  
 was committed for contempt, consisted in placing  
 Alexander Hagar, in expelling torpedo in or  
 well being the act of infringement for which  
 Hagar was also committed in the case No. 3, No. 7,  
 under Term, 1866, as before stated.

The Court McKean, J., after delivering his  
 opinion in the Hagar case, presided in the present  
 case as follows for contempt, and delivered the fol-  
 lowing opinion:

In the case of Nicholas Geyer charged with the  
 same offense, I have already said that there was  
 no present in the Hagar case, at least. As I have  
 indicated in the notice in the course of the argu-  
 ment, the presence of fluid in the well, whether de-  
 rived up or not, is an infringement of the patent, and a  
 breach of the injunction of the Court.

Mr. Roberts, by his present case as one of the prin-  
 cipal elements of his invention fluid tampering, and  
 whenever there is fluid sufficient in a well, at the  
 time of the explosion of a torpedo, to operate as  
 tamping, whether it gets there naturally or is put  
 there artificially, his patent is infringed. This was  
 clearly the case in regard to the Hagar well.

But Mr. Geyer seems to have been misled by  
 Hagar, who told him that he merely wanted to  
 make an experiment, and I do not think, this being  
 the first time, that he ought to be very severely  
 punished.

It is also admitted fully of defendant and order  
 ed to pay the costs of this proceeding, and undergo  
 an imprisonment in the County jail for ten days—  
 I hope it will be the last of these cases, because  
 if the matter comes to our notice again, it will be  
 constrained to impose such penalties as will tend  
 to the prevention of such a repetition.
