THE TORPEDO PATENT SUITS.
Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer.
 The following is the decision rendered by Judge McKeenan, of the District Court of the District of Columbia:
 In the Circuit Court of the United States, in and for the District of Columbia, at the City of Washington, D. C., in the case of Nicholas Geyer vs. John Roberts, No. 1,133—May Term, 1873—In Equity.
 November 22, 1873. 1873 Sd and judgment is made.

Subpoena and notice of application for preliminary injunction served.
 December 13, 1873. Motion for preliminary injunction denied, and the Court being duly advised in the premises the injunction awarded as prayed for, and do hereby.
 January 11, 1874. Injunction issued, and on the 23rd day of January defendant served personally and by copy.
 May 22, 1874. This cause docketed to show cause why a judgment should not issue for contempt in violating injunction and duly served.
 June 24, 1874. This cause docketed in this case cause on to be heard, and after argument of counsel pro and con, the Court being fully advised in the premises, the Court is of the opinion, and the sentence of the Court is, that the said defendant, Nicholas Geyer, be imprisoned in the common jail of the District of Columbia for and during the term of ten days, and that he pay the costs of this proceeding.

June 24, 1874. Comment issued.
 The injunction in this case was for infringement of the Robert's patent of No. — (called the Hot Torpedo), and for using the production of oil wells. The act of infringement, consisted in aiding Alexander Hazzar in exploding torpedoes in oil wells being the same act of infringement for which Hazzar was also committed in the case No. 3, No. 10,000 Term, 1870, as before stated.
 The Court McKeenan, J., after delivering his opinion in the Hazzar case, proceeded on remand Nicholas Geyer for contempt, and delivered the following oral opinion:
 In the case of Nicholas Geyer charged with the same offense, I am entirely satisfied that there was a fraud present in the Hazzar case. As I have intimated to the court in the course of the argument, the presence of fraud in the well, whether decided or not, is an infringement of the patent, and a breach of the injunction of the Court.
 Mr. Roberts, by his patent uses as one of the principal elements of his invention fluid tapping, and wherever there is fluid sufficient in a well, at the time of the explosion of a torpedo, to operate as a tamping, whether it gets there naturally or is put there artificially, his patent is infringed. This was clearly the case in regard to the Hazzar well.
 But Mr. Geyer seems to have been misled by Hazzar, who told him that he merely used to make an experiment and I do not think, this being the first time, that he ought to be very severely punished.
 He also is adjudged guilty of contempt and ordered to pay the costs of this proceeding, and undergo an imprisonment in the county jail for ten days. I hope this will be the last of these cases, because, if the matter comes to me, not only will I be constrained to impose such punishment as will tend to make it deterrence of the Court's officials.
