

Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer.

The following is the decision rendered by Judge McKenna, at May Term of the Circuit Court in the above case:

In the Circuit Court of the United States, in and for the Western District of Pennsylvania—R. A. L.

Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer—No. 1—May Term 1873—In Equity.

November 21, 1872. Bill filed and subpoena issued.

Subpoena and notice of application for preliminary injunction served.

December 13, 1872. Motion for preliminary injunction heard, and the Court being duly advised in the premises; the injunction awarded as prayed for, and decree given.

January 14, 1873. Injunction issued, and on the 29th day of January defendant served personally and by copy.

May 22, 1873. Rule issued for defendant to show cause why attachment should not issue for contempt in violating injunction and duly served.

June 2d, 1873.
