**TORPEDO PATENT**  
**Roberts vs. Nicholas**

The following is the decision rendered by the Court in the case of Roberts vs. Nicholas, at May Term of the Circuit Court of the United States for the Western District of Pennsylvania, in the case of Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer, No. 1, 1873—In Equity.

November 21, 1872. Bill filed and answered.

Subpoena and notice of application for an injunction served.

December 13, 1872. Motion for injunction heard, and the Court being of the opinion that the injunction awarded and decrees filed.

January 14, 1873. Injunction issued 25th day of January indictment served and by copy.

May 22, 1873. Rule issued for default cause why attachment should not issue in violation of injunction and duly served.

June 24, 1873. Rule for attachment issued and on to be heard, and after argument pro and con, the Court being full of premises, the Rule is made absolute, the sentence of the Court is, that the said Nicholas Geyer, be imprisoned in the County Jail of Allegheny County for and during the term of days, and that he pay the costs of the bill.

June 24, 1873. Commitment issued.

The injunction in this case was for the Roberts' patent of No. 1 (in the case), for the use of the prodigious power of the act of infringement for which he was committed for contempt, against Alexander Hamer in exploding torpedoes, the same act of infringement Hamer was also committed in the case of Hamer Term, 1866, as before stated.

The Court McKean, J., after his opinion in the Hamer case, proceeded in Nicholas Geyer for contempt, and giving the following opinion:

In the case of Nicholas Geyer charged with the same offense, I am entirely satisfied that the defendant is not guilty of the offense charged, and the Court being of the opinion that the presence of fraud in the will, proved or not, is an infringement of the branch of the injunction of the Court.

Mr. Roberts, by his patent new and original elements of his invention for the purpose of the explosion of a torpedo, by means of a fuse, whether it gets there naturally or artificially, his patent is infringed, clearly the case in regard to the Hamer case, but Mr. Geyer seems to have been misled, who told him that he merely made an experiment, and I do not think the first time, that he ought to be punished.

He also is adjudged guilty of contempt for not paying the costs of this proceeding, and an imprisonment in the County Jail for one month, which will be the last of these cases, if the matter comes to our notice again, we are constrained to impose such punishment as to make the decree of the Court effective.
