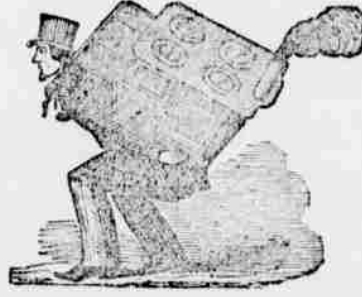

TORPEDO PATENT SUITS

Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer

The following is the decision rendered by the Circuit Court of the United States, in the Western District of Pennsylvania, in the case of Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer—No. 1—May 1872.—In Equity.

November 21, 1872. Bill filed and answered.

Subpoena and notice of application for preliminary injunction served.

December 11, 1872. Motion for preliminary injunction denied, and the Court held only upon the premises, the injunction was granted as prayed and decreed.

January 14, 1873. Injunction dissolved, and a writ of habeas corpus issued.

May 22, 1873. Pleadings filed for defendants to show why attachment should not issue for contempt in violating injunction and duly served.

June 24, 1873. Bill for attachment in equity came on to be heard, and after argument in pro and con, the Court being fully advised on the premises, the Pleadings were made absolute, and the terms of the Court is, that the said defendant, Nicholas Geyer, be imprisoned in the County Jail of Allegheny County for and during the term of ten days, and that he pay the costs of this proceeding.

June 24, 1873. Judgment rendered.

The injunction in this case was for the enforcement of the Roberts' patent of No. 1—(which the Plaintiff) for increasing the productivity of steam engines. The act of infringement for which the defendant was committed for contempt, consisted in the defendant's manufacturing and selling torpedoes, which were being the same act of infringement for which the Plaintiff was also committed in the case No. 2—November Term, 1868, as before stated.

The Court Mr. McKean, J. a ter delictum opinion in the Roberts' case, proceeded to state Nicholas Geyer for contempt, and delivered the following oral opinion:

In the case of Nicholas Geyer charged with contempt, I am entirely satisfied that there is no present, in the hands of the defendant, any torpedoes in the course of the case, the presence of fluid in the well, whether stirred or not, is an infringement of the patent, as each of the injunction of the Court.

Mr. Roberts, by his patent uses as one of the principal elements of his invention fluid tamping, wherever there is fluid sufficient in a well, at the time of the explosion of a torpedo, to operate tamping, whether it gets there naturally or is there artificially, his patent is infringed. This clearly the case in regard to the Beals well.

But Mr. Geyer seems to have been misled by Hamar, who told him that he merely used to make an experiment and I do not think he is the first time, that he ought to be very severely punished.

He also is adjudged guilty of contempt and ordered to pay the costs of this proceeding and to be imprisoned in the county jail for ten days, unless he will be the last of the case, because if the matter comes to our notice again, we will be constrained to impose such punishment as will be made the decree of the Court effective.
