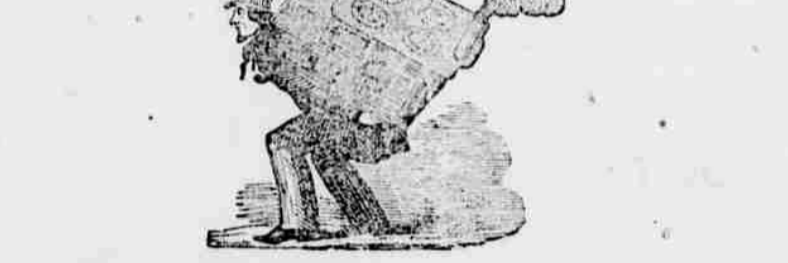

THE TORPEDO PATENT SUITS.

Robt. vs. Nicholas Geyer.

The following is the decision rendered by Judge M. Keenan, at May Term of the Circuit Court in the above case:

In the Circuit Court of the United States, in and for the Western District of Pennsylvania - P. A. L. Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer - No. 1 - May Term 1873.

November 22, 1872. Bill filed and return thereon returned.

December 23, 1872. Motion for preliminary injunction denied, and the Court being only advised in the premises, the judgment awarded as prayed for and entered thereon.

Defendant defaulted in this case cause set on for trial, and for appointment of counsel pro and con, the Court being fully advised in the premises, the case is made absolute, and the sentence of the Court is that the said defendant, Nicholas Geyer, be imprisoned in the common Jail of Allegheny County for and during the term of ten days, and that he pay the costs of this proceeding.

June 24, 1873. Certificate issued.
