**TORPEDO PATENT**

**Roberts vs. Nicholas G.**

The following is the decision rendered by McKeanan, at May Term of the Circuit Court above case:

In the Circuit Court of the United States, in the Western District of Pennsylvania, in the case of Roberts vs. Nicholas Geyer—No. 1—May 1875.—In Equity.

November 21, 1872. Bill filed and returned.

Subpoena and notice of application for injunction served.

December 13, 1872. Motion for injunction heard, and the Court being duly advised by the parties, the injunction awarded as prayed and decreed &c.

January 14, 1873. Injunction issued, on 29th day of January indictment served by and by copy.

May 22, 1873. Bill filed for enforcement of injunction and return made for enforcement of injunction and return made for enforcement of injunction.

June 21, 1874. Injunction awarded as prayed and decreed &c.

June 22, 1872. Court held.

The injunction in this case was for the enforcement of the patent of Nicholas Geyer, for his invention of the torpedo, which was issued to him on the 21st day of January, 1872.

The act of infringement, for which the defendant was held liable, consisted in the manufacture and sale of torpedoes, which were found to be identical with those of the plaintiff.

Mr. Roberts, by his patent attorney, filed a bill in equity, praying for an injunction to restrain the defendant from the manufacture and sale of torpedoes, which were found to be identical with those of the plaintiff.

The Court, in its opinion, held that the defendant's torpedoes were identical with those of the plaintiff, and that the defendant was liable for infringement of the plaintiff's patent.

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
