WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—The following despatch has been received at the Headquarters of the Army: "Nashville, Feb. 2, 1864.—General Dodge reports that on the 24th ult. our forces, under Col. Phillips, drove Roddy to the south side of the Tennessee river, and captured all his trains, consisting of over 20 mule teams, 200 head of cattle, 600 head of sheep and 100 horses and mules. We destroyed a factory and mill that they were building."
