FROM THE ARMY OF THE CUMBERLAND. Knoxville, March 28.—About sixty rebel deserters came into our lines during the past week, making a total of over eleven hundred for the past three months.

THE OUTBREAK IN ILLINOIS. Mattoon, Ill., March 30th.—On the receipt of the news of the riot at Charleston, Illinois, 250 men of 64th Illinois regiment, rendezvousing here, went to that place.

Reports from different sources say that the rebels are from 1,000 to 1,500 strong, and will attack this place to-night.

FROM CALIFORNIA, OREGON AND IDAHO. San Francisco, March 30.—The steamer Golden Gate arrived last night from Panama.

MOVEMENTS OF THE REBEL FORCES. St. Louis, March 31.—The Democrat has received a special despatch from Cairo stating that the main body of Forrest's force have been ordered to Jackson, Tenn.

INTERESTING FROM ST. LOUIS. St. Louis, March 31.—General Grant has ordered the seizure of Col. J. B. Southern's history of the war, the Confederate Official Reports, the Life of Stonewall Jackson, the Life of Morgan, and all publications based upon rebel information.

A STEAMER IN DISTRESS. New York, March 31.—The steamer Fulton reports falling in with a propeller in distress on Tuesday night, which wanted assistance.

THE REBELS PREPARING FOR A RAID IN EAST KENTUCKY. Louisville, March 30.—About 100 rebels, under the command of Col. Foy, crossed the Cumberland river at Edwysville yesterday.

DISASTERS TO THE FISHING FLEET. Boston, March 31.—Accounts from the fishing fleet on George's Bank describe the severe case of the 22d last. About 150 sail were on the banks. One schooner was dismantled and one man lost.
