

THE WAR FOR THE UNION.

FROM THE ARMY OF THE POTOMAC. WASHINGTON, April 22.—Colonel Lowell returned to Vienna last night with his cavalry brigade from an expedition through London county. Anticipating an expedition in force...

LATER FROM NORTH CAROLINA. WASHINGTON, April 22.—The following information was received here to-day concerning the recent disaster at Plymouth, N. C. A rebel ran came down the river about three o'clock on Monday morning, floated down to the house of the late General Sherman, and was discovered until close on the bows of the ship. Lieutenant Commander C. W. Flusser rushed forward, sighted and fired the gun, loaded with a shell, which struck the ram, rebounded, and instantly killed him, a piece of the shell cutting his heart out.

GENERAL BUTLER'S DEPARTMENT. FORTRESS MONROE, April 21.—A Richmond spy was captured near Eastville, Northampton county, Va., on the 18th inst. He was armed with a revolver, slung shot and knife. A number of small steel springs and files were found sewed in the lining of his coat. He was one of a party of three who were shot and the other closely pursued, until he was despatched from Major White, Provost Marshal at Eastville, would be either captured or killed. The one that was captured is in close confinement in the military prison of this place.

WASHINGTON, April 22.—A report to-day, in executive session, confirmed the nomination of Brigadier-General Joseph G. Totten, Chief Engineer of the United States Army, to be Major-General by brevet from April 21st, 1864. He has been cited for some time past, and the nomination was intended by the President as a compliment to his long public service of sixty-two years.
