Southern Reconstruction. Provisional Governor Holden, of North Carolina, has been relieved of his duties.

The letter to him was couched in the same complimentary terms as those sent to the other Governors. The response was as follows:

lows: RALEIGH, Dec. 23, 1865.—To the Hon. W. H. Seward, Secretary of State—SIR: Your despatch of this date, relieving me of my duties as Provisional Governor of North Carolina, has been received. It gives me pleasure to be relieved of the responsibilities and labors of the office. I will at once transfer the great seal, papers and property of the State, now in my possession, to the Hon. Jonathan Worth, the Governor-elect. Be pleased to convey to the President my sincere acknowledgments for the honor he has done me, and the confidence reposed in me in calling me to this position, with the expression of the hope that his plan for re-constructing the insurgent States to their natural and appropriate place in the Union may be crowned with entire success. I have the honor to be, with the highest respect, your obedient servant, W. W. Holden.

ville. Your despatch has been forwarded to him by mail. It will be very gratifying to the people of South Carolina that her government has been intrusted to officers of their own selection. In their name I thank you for the tender of co-operation of the government of the United States, when found necessary, in effecting the early restoration and permanent prosperity and welfare of the State. # Gen. Gibbon on Tournaments.

Gen. John Gibbon, commanding at Petersburg, has issued the following order: "HEADQUARTERS DISTRICT OF THE NOT-

TOWAY, PETERSBURG, VA., Dec. 19, 1865.-General Orders No. 41.-It having been reported to these headquarters that a certain social gathering is to be held in this city, only with the understanding that no Yankees' are to be invited thereto, and the Major General commanding being satisfied that the idea of such a restriction could have emanated only from the intellect of those too craven to fight in defence of their opinions, or too degraded to appreciate the liberal spirit in which they have been treated, it is hereby ordered that at the tournament to be held on Wednesday, the 20th instant, no officer or soldier of the United States shall lend to any party in said tournament any horse, saddle, bridle, or equipment of any kind; and all persons loyal to the Government of the United States are warned against attending such disreputable and disloyal meeting, that those who do attend may be marked as unworthy to associate with those who have honor and honesty enough to regard their oaths of allegiance as something more

than lip service, and too much principle to be blindly led by a foolish woman. "It is further ordered that no officer having Government property in his charge, will, until further orders, use such property in any way for the benefit of any eitizen of
