THE PHILADELPHIA-NEW YORK MATCH. We alluded, last week, briefly to the fact that a match has been arranged between Mr. Reichelm, of this city, and Mr. George H. Mackenzie, the champion of the New York Tournament.

The first contest was the famous Correspondence Match played in 1856-7, between Messrs. Montgomery, Randolph, Thomas, Lewis and Dougherty, of Philadelphia, against a Committee of the best New York players.

The match played in March, 1861, between Messrs. Leonard, of New York, and Dwight, of Philadelphia, is not to be included in the list of matches between the two cities, as it was only a private and personal trial.

The present match, which commenced last evening, at the New York Chess Club, is for the first seven games. By mutual consent, the moves are to be limited to an average of five minutes, and only one game is to be played at each sitting, unless otherwise agreed upon.

Mr. Mackenzie has already played several important matches with Messrs. Anderson, Deacon, McDonnell and Medley, besides his recent play in the New York Tournament, but Mr. Reichelm has as yet played none but unimportant matches with members of the Philadelphia Club, and occasional off-hand contests with visitors from abroad.

We shall report the progress of the match from day to day, in our regular editions.
